Final £5000 grant agreed to complete new building at St John's College, Wau

In a wonderful answer to prayer, the last tranche of money needed to complete the Poole-Wau Partnership Building at St John's College, Wau has been secured. On 3rd February we heard from the Slavanka Trust that our application for a grant of £5000 to enable the college to complete the final stage of construction (fitting the doors, windows and wall, floor & ceiling finishes) has been successful.

As reported in Newsletter 63, in November PWP sent £15,000 to Wau to enable work on this last stage of the project to begin, and also applied to the Slavanka Trust for a £5000 grant to complete it. PWP Trustee **Richard Tazewell**, who drew up and submitted the application on our behalf, received the wonderful news from John Owen, Secretary of the trust: "At our Trustees Meeting last Monday we agreed a grant of £5,000 in line with your application."

After just over two years, our Appeal to fund this project to provide St John's College with four purpose-built lecture rooms and two offices has been successful. In all PWP has raised just over £40,000 for this project (including £16,500 in grants from the Slavanka Trust and Charis Trust), while also continuing to send £18,000 per year to the college to help pay teaching staff salaries and other running costs.

Our grateful thanks go to all our supporters and churches in Poole & North Bournemouth Deanery who have contributed generously towards bringing this project to fruition, as well as to the Slavanka and Charis Trusts.



Trauma awareness training in Wau

A week-long course for community trauma awareness trainers took place in late January at the Good Shepherd Cathedral in Wau.

The course, supported by USAID-funded Sheja Salam, aimed to train the participants to recognize signs of trauma, often the result of years of civil war, in people of the communities in which they serve. Bicycles were presented to those who took part in the course to help them travel to different communities during their trauma awareness work (see right).

The course was delivered by **CLIP** (Church Leaders Initiative for Peace), founded by Archbishop Moses Deng Bol and other church leaders to promote peace and reconciliation throughout South Sudan. It followed a three-day dialogue in the cathedral in late November 2023, also organised by CLIP and supported by Sheja Salam, which brought together representatives from eight ethnic groups.

"I always believe," commented Archbishop Moses, "that these small initiatives will eventually culminate in peace and reconciliation among the people of South Sudan."

Book Aid sends I I 00 books to St John's College

The UK charity Book Aid International has sent a consignment of 1,092 books for St John's College, Wau. The thirty-eight cartons of books are expected to arrive at the University of Juba in mid-February, from where St John's staff will collect them.

This will be a highly beneficial boost to St John's College Library, which will support students for years to come.

All the books sent out by Book Aid International are brand new, and the consignment has been carefully chosen to support the courses offered at the college. Publishers, including Bloomsbury, Hachette UK, HarperCollins, Macmillan, Oxford University Press, and Penguin Random House donate overstocks, office copies and returns to Book Aid International, which then sends them to more than 185 partner organisations in many parts of the world.
